Prior to the commencement of the meeting, the outgoing Mayor invited her Chaplain, The Reverend Prebendary Alan White, to deliver prayers.

PRESENTATION FRENCH LEGION D'HONNEUR – ANTONY PORTMAN

The Mayor, advised Council that the Royal Naval Association had requested that the Town Council make the prestigious presentation of Legion d'honneur to a local resident, Mr Antony Portman. The Mayor highlighted his career in the Royal Navy, having joined in 1937 as an 11-year-old boy sailor he trained as an Asdic operator. During the Normandy landings Tony was stationed on the bridge of HMS Nelson.

During his career he had been awarded the following medals: 39/45; Atlantic Star, Africa Star, Italy Star, Defence Medal and War Medal 39/45. To commemorate the 70th Anniversary of D-Day in June 2014 the French President announced that the Legion d'honneur would be awarded to British Veterans who fought for the liberation of France during the Second World War; Mr Portman had been selected for such an award. The Mayor then presented Mr Antony Portman with the French Legion d'honneur and was applauded by the Council and those guests present, for such a notable award.

RETIRING MAYOR

The Mayor, Councillor Mrs Ann Jones, reported on her year of office, commenting on how quickly it had passed and that it had been an honour to represent the Town at over 120 engagements where upon she had met some wonderful people and made new friends. She thanked all her fellow Councillors, officers of the Town Council, and her consort Mr Chris Jones for their tremendous support during the busy year. She felt it a great privilege to have been able to represent the people of the town and had particularly appreciated the varied mix of events she had been invited to attend.

In recording her appreciation to all the people of Newton Abbot for supporting her charities, she announced that they had raised £2,103.44 and presented cheques to the Towersey Foundation £1,053.22 and Meadowside Care Home £1,053.22. Both organisations thanked the Mayor and the Town Council for their support and acknowledged the benefit the financial assistance would bring for their respective charities.

The Mayor recorded her appreciation for the support received from Members of the Council in carrying out her duties throughout her year of office, she particularly thanked her Chaplain Rev Prebendary Alan White, her Cadet Sergeant Jack Hewitt and Sea Cadet Imogen Fuller and noted that they carried out their roles with enthusiasm and dignity. She thanked the Town Council staff for their support, and in particular the Mayor's Secretary Mrs Carla Winsborrow and Handyman, Kieran Dore. The Mayor thanked fellow Councillor Mrs Carol Bunday for accompanying her on the Twinning Event to Besigheim and attending musical engagements; all of whom she presented with gifts and cards. Councillor Bunday thanked the Mayor for her considerable efforts on behalf of the Town Council. The Mayor especially thanked her husband, Mr Chris Jones and their daughters who had been a tremendous support throughout her Mayoral Year.

Honorary Freeman of the Town, Mr Henry Cole thanked the Mayor and reminded those present that she always entered into the 'spirit' of the event, dressing for the occasion and he paid tribute to her service to Newton Abbot.

The Mayor thanked everyone once more for the guidance and encouragement that had been extended to her and recorded that it had been an honour to be Mayor.

The Mayor concluded that she hoped that the new Council would continue with such support and she wished the very best for the incoming Mayor.

1. ELECTION OF TOWN MAYOR – 2018/2019

The Mayor invited nominations for the election of the Town Mayor for the ensuing year.

It was proposed and seconded that Councillor Ken Purchase be elected Mayor for the year 2018/19.

There being no other nominations it was

RESOLVED that Councillor Ken Purchase be hereby elected Mayor of Newton Abbot for the year 2018/2019.

Upon transferral of the Mayoral Chain to Councillor Purchase, Councillor Mrs Jones was presented with a Past-Mayor's insignia and floral bouquet.

2. **DECLARATION OF ACCEPTANCE OF OFFICE**

Councillor K Purchase read and signed the Declaration of Acceptance of Office.

During his acceptance speech, Councillor Purchase thanked his family, friends and the Town Councillors for their support and paid tribute to the outgoing Mayor and expressed his hope to continue the excellent leadership demonstrated by Councillor Jones and for the Councillors to continue to work together in support of the town. He acknowledged the prestigious honour of being Elected Mayor and his commitment to it.

The Mayor was pleased to announce that his wife, Dulcie Purchase would be his Mayoress; the Reverend Patrick Parkes, had agreed to be his Chaplain for the year. He nominated his charities to be Street Pastors Newton Abbot and Dyrans Journal Talking Newspaper and he announced that Cadet Corporal Jacob Whittle would be his Cadet for the forthcoming year.

The Mayor invited Councillor David Howe (the Father of the House) to respond to the outgoing Mayor's comments. He paid tribute to Councillor Jones on the Council's behalf. Councillor Howe referred to Councillor Jones as always being busy and joining in the Town's events with enthusiasm. He added that she was retiring following a very good year and that everyone appreciated the efforts that Councillor Jones had made on behalf of the Town and Town Council. Councillor Howe welcomed the Incoming Mayor and wished him well for the forthcoming year.

Councillor Richard Jenks read and signed the Declaration of Acceptance of Office.

The Mayor congratulated Councillor Richard Jenks upon his appointment as the Deputy Mayor. Councillor Jenks thanked the Council for his appointment and recorded that it would be a privilege and honour to serve the Council and that he would work with the whole Council to deliver the Council's priorities and he was looking forward to the year ahead.
