115. WELCOME FROM THE MAYOR

The Mayor welcomed everyone and opened the meeting.

116. APOLOGIES

Apologies for absence were received on behalf of Councillor N Yabsley and Nigel Canham – Communications Advisor. Members **agreed** to approve Councillor Yabsley's reason for absence.

117. INTERESTS

Councillor M Ryan declared a personal interest in agenda item 4, Co-Option, as one of the candidates is a family member. Councillor Ryan confirmed that he will participate in the voting.

118. **CO-OPTION**

The Mayor outlined in detail the procedure to be followed in co-opting six applicants to the vacancies in the Bradley x 1; Brunel x 1 and College x 4 Wards which had arisen from the May 4th 2023 local council elections. Upon advising that the Co-Option Policy stated voting should take place by a show of hands, in accordance with Standing Order 5, two members rose to request a vote by ballot.

The Council was informed that of the 17 applications received, all but one was prepared to express a preference for a single Ward, as implied on the application form. As this was not explicit, one applicant would appear in all three ballots.

Members were accordingly invited to vote by ballot for each Ward alphabetically.

BRADLEY - Members voted for one position from four applications, as follows:-

Bailey Gillibrand Hall Hunt Arising from the vote, Brian Bailey was announced as successful.

BRUNEL - Members voted for one position from four applications, as follows:-

Cook Hartley Hunt Northcott

Arising from the vote, which required a second vote as no applicant had the required majority, Jamie Cook was announced as successful.

COLLEGE - Members voted for four position from eleven applications, as follows:-

Boulton Bradford Gearon Gibbs Hanson Hunt Jennings Jones Knopfler Murray Wood

Arising from the vote, which required four votes as to achieve the required majority, Bradford, Gibbs, Jennings and Wood were announced as successful.
